ONE DAY TOURNAMENT: FEBRUARY 8, 2020.

As recently mentioned, participation in our traditional tournament have not attracted the same number of bowlers as in the past. But our "One Day" tournaments remain popular. They typically include almost all bowlers who are at Holmby on that particular day. Our One Day tournaments are always on Saturdays, so we can also include members who can only bowl during weekends.

THE ALLISON SINGLES TOURNAMENT 2020.

The Allison is one of our most prestigious tournament. Named after Bill Allison (our 16th President, from 1963 to 65) it is for our most competitive bowlers. This year, 16 bowlers entered. They look determined on the group photo shown on page 1 of this newsletter. The first round started on February 25.

Our singles tournaments are still viable because no teammate is inconvenienced if a bowler is unable to turn up for the next round match. In Pairs and Triples one player's non appearance can cause disappointment for teammates. In the Allison Singles it is rare that a player gets a 'walk over'. The bowlers are dedicated and the matches are closely contested.



Not unexpectedly, Cecil and Harry reached the final which was played on March 3. The two veterans had a wonderful match both playing exceptionally well. At the end. Cecil deservedly beat the current singles champion, Harry. Congrats to our two top players!

MEMBERSHIP/RECRUITING.

After four years of extraordinarily painful losses, we need to take extraordinarily effective measures to ensure our club's viability, I am not going to sugarcoat it. Here are the sobering numbers:

Indeed, during these otherwise pleasant and successful last four years, we lost 76 members. This is more than the total current membership in most other SWD clubs. This also equals our starting membership in 2020.

On the bright side, our number of novices who renewed their membership during the last two years is exceptionally high, both as a percentage (82%) and in total numbers (35 new members in two years). Even more importantly, many of these novices enjoy the game and participate regularly. Still, the losses hurt. Just imagine your club without the addition of these 35 novices.

As far as we know, these losses did not occur because bowlers lost their enthusiasm for the game. We have lost members mostly for two reasons: health problems and relocations. Neither of these two can be influenced by smarter retention methods. But facts must be faced. This year, special recruiting (and retention) efforts have to be organized and we need all of you to help.

Philip Fox was appointed as Chair of the Membership Committee for 2020. We have 10 other volunteers who will participate in this committee's work. They will implement new ideas and continue with those methods that were successful in the past. You need to help only with your personal recruiting among your friends. Let's do it!

PARTICIPATION.

Even more important is participation in our activities. We can analyze membership numbers, print our Roster to include all those who paid their dues, but what really matters is the number of members who regularly bowl at HPLBC. We need a 'critical mass', a minimum number of bowlers playing on our greens to make our bowling days meaningful and to attract new members. To put it charitably, trends in participation during the last two years are not encouraging.

OUR GREENS.

The impact of the quality of our greens on our bowling can hardly be overstated. It is an uphill battle as the RAP is in full charge of the maintenance. A week ago we even offered split responsibility which would have given us an opportunity to outsource and pay a professional maintenance provider. We learned that under current regulations this would not be possible.

We had three meetings in February with the Superintendents of the RAP. Bill Wolff also came from Beverly Hills to advise us about our irrigation system. It seems that part of our problem is inappropriate watering. We hope the RAP will follow Bill's suggestions and improve our greens. As it is, we decided to bowl only on the lower green until the upper green will improve. It will now be used only when we have more than 48 bowlers playing at the same time.

PROMOTIAL VIDEO TO MARKET OUR SPORT.

Our 'super novice' Vaughn Feather has successfully been helping with our 2020 recruiting. He recently persuaded his friend Rob, to produce a video about our sport in general and about our club in particular. On March 3, Rob came to Holmby, interviewed many members and spent hours to create yet another promotional tool for us. In March the work will be edited and the final version uploaded to our website. Your comments are always welcome.


One measure is that this amount could provide monthly spiders prize money for more than four years. Thank you.
